Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information received 22/01/2021.

I note you seek access to the following information:

1. *The total number of FPNs issued for breaches of the self-isolation regulations, mentioned above, since they were introduced on 28 September to date. Please break this data down by age, ethnic group, gender, and any known disabilities.*
2. *College of Policing guidance advises that: "Where NHS Test and Trace confirm that an individual should be self-isolating, forces will risk assess the report and, if appropriate, police officers and/or PCSOs will visit the address provided by the individual as the place where they are self-isolating to determine compliance with the Regulations". Please could you provide me a copy of any and all form(s) used to risk assess reports before determining compliance with the regulations?*

Following receipt of your request, searches were conducted within Leicestershire Police to locate information relevant to your request.

Your request for information has now been considered and the information asked for is as follows: -

1. Leicestershire Police have recorded 28 Self-Isolation breaches since 28th September 2020. This can be broken down to the below groups as requested:
 - a. Gender
 - Male - 18
 - Female - 10
 - b. Ethnicity
 - White-North European – 18
 - Asian – 8
 - Chinese - 2
 - c. Age
 - 18-29 – 7
 - 30-39 – 7
 - 40-49 – 7
 - 50-29 – 7

2. Leicestershire Police do not have a specific risk assessment form for this purpose. We do however receive a form from NHS Track & Trace with a section requiring Police completion. You would need to contact them directly for this.

Leicestershire Police provides you the right to ask for a re-examination of your request under its review procedure. Letters should be addressed to Information Manager, Corporate Services Department at the above address. If you decide to request such a review and having followed the Force's full process you are still dissatisfied, then you have the right to direct your comments to the Information Commissioner who will give it consideration.
