### **Freedom of Information Act 2000**

I write further to your request for information received 08/06/2021.

I note you seek access to the following information:

- *I would like to know how many thefts occurred from robbers on a moped between 2019 to 2020 and 2020 to 2021.*
- *If possible, I would also like to know the address of each complaint. Just the town name is sufficient if full address cannot be provided.*
- *I would also like to know the items that were stolen. (E.g., mobile phone, headphones, etc)*
- o *If the data is easily accessible, please provide the phone model/make, headphone make etc.*

Following receipt of your request, searches were conducted within Leicestershire Police to locate information relevant to your request.

### **Your request for information has now been considered and the information asked for is as follows: -**

Please note:

These are all the acquisitive crimes in which the suspect was (believed) to be riding a moped. However, I would comment that in many of these the moped seems to have been the "getaway vehicle" rather than being directly involved in the facilitation of the crime. There are some where a moped rider has "snatched" items from a pedestrian but equally instances where, for instance, a moped rider has stopped next to an unattended vehicle or premises stolen items then made away on the moped.

Also, under the Home Office Counting rules an Acquisitive crime is recorded regardless of whether any property is actually taken if a clear attempt to take is made. Hence there are a number where I have put "Attempt Only" in the Property Taken column.

Leicestershire Police provides you the right to ask for a re-examination of your request under its review procedure. Letters should be addressed to Information Manager, Corporate Services Department at the above address. If you decide to request such a review and having followed the Force's full process you are still dissatisfied, then you have the right to direct your comments to the Information Commissioner who will give it consideration.
