Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information received 24/06/2021.

I note you seek access to the following information:

*I would like information as to why there was a mobile speed camera on the 10/06/2010 on the Beaumont leys lane Leicestershire.
all information such as number of accidents, types of accident research data when was it taken by who. and all relevant documents relating to that decision.*

Following receipt of your request, searches were conducted within Leicestershire Police to locate information relevant to your request.

Your request for information has now been considered and the information asked for is as follows: -

Beaumont Leys Lane has been a core mobile camera site since July 2006. It was established in consultation with Leicester City Council and approved by The Department for Transport who ran the National Safety Camera Programme at that time.

Beaumont Leys Lane was identified as having a high number of injury collisions; 4 serious injury collisions and 27 slight injury collisions between 01/10/2002 and 30/09/2005. Speeds were also high with an average speed of 33mph being recorded in July 2005.

As with all core camera sites advisory camera signs are displayed to advise drivers that enforcement may take place along the road.

Since enforcement began collisions have reduced on the road but are still occurring. The past 3 years have seen 1 serious and 7 slight injury collisions. Speeds have reduced also with an average speed of 26mph being recorded in 2019. A further speed survey will take place next year.

All sites are regularly reviewed by the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Road Safety Partnership, of which the relevant Highway Authorities are members, and

currently there are no plans to withdraw mobile van enforcement from Beaumont Leys Lane.

Leicestershire Police provides you the right to ask for a re-examination of your request under its review procedure. Letters should be addressed to Information Manager, Corporate Services Department at the above address. If you decide to request such a review and having followed the Force's full process you are still dissatisfied, then you have the right to direct your comments to the Information Commissioner who will give it consideration.
